> The undersigned, Arthur Josua Mayer, a medical Doctor, with offices and residing at 129 South Pacific Avenue, Redondo Beach, California, and his wife, Margarethe Mayer, who resides together with him at the same address, most respectfully bring to your attention the fact that while we are compelled through the regulation now existing in the Unites States of America to register as enemy aliens, we are in reality not enemy aliens, but both imbued with a great love and admiration for the land of liberty, opportunity, and equality, the United States of America, which gave us an asylum at a time when we, as Jews, were deprived of every right, dispossessed and robbed of our property by Hitler.

I, Dr. Arthur Josua Mayer, am not a native of Germany. I was born in Varsovia, Poland, and I entered the United States on a Polish quota number. I lost my German citizenship first in 1935 by the Nurnberg Laws; and in the first month of 1941, the German Consul at Los Angeles told me that my German citizenship was taken away from me in 1939 for political reasons. I thereupon notified the Department of Justice, Alien Registration, on January 28, 1941, of this fact and asked to take notice of this change. Furthermore, every non-Aryan German living abroad was expatriated and his property confiscated by decree of November, 1941. While residing in Germany, I was a member of the Council of the Democratic Party. I took part in the fight against Hitler and Hitlerism. When Hitler took power, I was expelled from the hespital where I was the medical director. I, together with my wife, was arrested by the Gestapo and threatened to be sent to a concentration camp. Both of us left Germany because of racial, religious, and political persecution and

I, Margarethe Mayer, am likewise not a native of Germany, I was born in Kremcier, Austria, later Czechoslovakia, and entered this country under the Polish quota with my husband. Dr. Arthur I, likewise, lost my German citizenship first in 1935 by the Nurnberg Laws. I was also told by the German Consul at Los Angeles in the first month of 1941 that our citizenship was taken from us in 1939 for political reasons. I also notified the Department of Justice, Alien Registration, on June 28, 1941, and we asked them to take notice of this change. Furthermore, every non-Aryan German living abroad was expatriated and his property confiscated by decree of November, 1941. While in German-Margarethe Mayer, was a vice-president of the Cerman Act and the International Actors' Union, a professor of the Academy of Dramatic Art, and a member of the Council of the Democratic Party. When Hitler took power, the Unions were dissolved and I was arrested by the Gestapo. All my participation in the political activities had to stop. I left Germany because of political, racial, and religious prejudice and restriction, and accepted an invitation of Frofessor Merill Moore of Harvard University, Boston, Massachusetts.

to come to the United States of America. I proceeded with my husband to California and reentered the country from Mexico for permanent stay. I applied for first citizenship papers immediately after my immigration and I received my Declaration of Intention to become a citizen of the United States on June 13, 1938.

The earnings that I, Arthur Josua Mayer, derive from the practice of medicine at 129 South Pacific Avenue, Redondo Beach, California, I must apply toward the obtaining of necessities of life for myself and my said wife. We have no other income or any other means to obtain our livelihood.

Being uprooted once in Germany, and being compelled to undergo the vicissitudes of oppression, wandering, and finding of a new home, almost broke our health and spirit, and it was only with the finding of a new home in this asylum for the oppressed in the United States of America, we began slowly to regain our health, our spirit, and our trust in humanity, and in the ultimate triumph of right and democracy, and now, for us, to be uprooted again may prove beyond our powers to endure.

Technically, as enemy aliens, there may be a real danger that we may be compelled to remove from the city of Redondo Beach, California, it being a part of the coastal area, and in order to obviate this danger, we call upon you to exercise your kind and good offices and help us, through ways and means that you will find appropriate, to remain where we are, unmolested, to pursue our honorable and sincere endeavor to make our honest living undisturbed, and thereby being of a service to ourselves, to suffering humanity, and to the great land of our adoption, the United States of America.

In anticipation of your kind courtesy and favor, we express to you our heartiest appreciation.
